This Ladue development has blossomed into a retail destination, with stores popping up there throughout the past year.

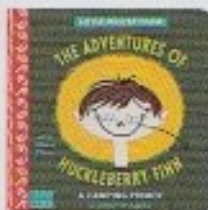


PAPER SOURCE
